Mark 3. 7-19 (English Standard Version)

⁷ Jesus withdrew with his disciples to the sea, and a great crowd followed, from Galilee and Judea ⁸ and Jerusalem and Idumea and from beyond the Jordan and from around Tyre and Sidon. When the great crowd heard all that he was doing, they came to him. ⁹ And he told his disciples to have a boat ready for him because of the crowd, lest they crush him, ¹⁰ for he had healed many, so that all who had diseases pressed around him to touch him. ¹¹ And whenever the unclean spirits saw him, they fell down before him and cried out, "You are the Son of God." ¹² And he strictly ordered them not to make him known.

¹³ And he went up on the mountain and called to him those whom he desired, and they came to him. ¹⁴ And he appointed twelve (whom he also named apostles) so that they might be with him and he might send them out to preach ¹⁵ and have authority to cast out demons. ¹⁶ He appointed the twelve: Simon (to whom he gave the name Peter); ¹⁷ James the son of Zebedee and John the brother of James (to whom he gave the name Boanerges, that is, Sons of Thunder); ¹⁸ Andrew, and Philip, and Bartholomew, and Matthew, and Thomas, and James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus, and Simon the Zealot, ¹⁹ and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him.

Sermon Quotes and References:

In every respect this new community is Jesus' doing. The ESV says, "He appointed twelve," but the Greek says, "he made Twelve." To appoint is to select from an existing lot & to raise them to a new status, but to make means to bring into existence. Mark's verb is the same as that of Gen 1.1 (in the Septuagint). It is very conceivable that Mark intends to recall the opening line of Genesis, "In the beginning God made heaven and earth," signifying that the Twelve are the start of a new creation formed by the gospel.

The new status of the disciples is also signified by their being named "apostles." This again may recall the creation theme, where Adam named the animals (Gen 2:19). In the biblical world the right to name belonged to a superior — maker, master, parent — who determined the essence & purpose of what was named.

James Edwards, The Gospel According to Mark

The biggest threat to the church today is fans who call themselves Christians but aren't actually interested in following Christ. They want to be close enough to Jesus to get all the benefits, but not so close that it requires anything from them ... Fans don't mind him doing a little touch-up work, but Jesus wants complete renovation. Fans come to Jesus thinking tune-up, but Jesus is thinking overhaul. Fans think a little makeup is fine, but Jesus is thinking makeover. Fans think a little decorating is required, but Jesus wants a complete remodel. Fans want Jesus to inspire them, but Jesus wants to interfere with their lives.

With a missions-minded upbringing, Rachel Hart developed a desire for missions at a young age. After a few mission trips to Ukraine, the Lord nurtured Rachell's heart for Ukraine.
