I. The Theology of Islam

The Five Pillars ...

- 1. Shahadah, or Confession of Faith. "There is no god but Allah, and Muhammad is his prophet."
- 2. Salah, or prayer 5 times day facing towards Mecca
- 3. Zakah, or giving charitable gifts of money to the poor
- 4. Sawm, or fasting in the holy month of Ramadan
- 5. *Hajj*, or the pilgrimage to Mecca, which a Muslim must try to do at least in his/her lifetime

Core beliefs ...


- Allah = God. He is one, and is completely separate from creation
- Allah is transcendent, not immanent
- Allah's main attribute is power
- Jesus was Muhammad's forerunner, but not divine
- The crucifixion of Jesus never happened, since Allah would never treat one of his prophets in this manner.
- Idolatry is the supreme sin
- The Koran, allegedly containing 14 messages from Gabriel to Muhammad, was the only "miracle" Muhammad performed

II. Life for the Church under Islamic rule


- Christians became segregated communities of 2nd-class citizens in the Islamic Empire
 - Organized under a bishop who bore political responsibility for the community
 - Required to pay a heavy poll tax
 - ➤ Had to wear distinctive clothing
 - ➤ Forbidden to use/use swords or horses
 - No public processions carrying crosses or icons allowed
 - ➤ Not permitted to ring bells or beat drums to announce worship services
 - Marriage between Muslims & Christians forbidden
 - Christians for bidden from evangelizing; conversion from Islam to Christianity punishable by death
